BATEUP BACK ON BOARD FOR AUSSIES

Kurrawa's **Hayley Bateup** has confirmed she will line up in her 16th Aussies at Kurrawa this year after recovering from major shoulder surgery and torn rib cartilages which has sidelined her all season.

Although she will not contest the prestigious Ironwoman event, Bateup will continue her remarkable love affair with board paddling, which has seen her contest every Australian open final since she won her first under 19 Australian malibu championship in 1998.

"The only individual water event I will contest this year is the open malibu board and I will also line up in the two-kilometre run and for Kurrawa in teams events as well," said 31-year-old Bateup, who would like nothing more than to at least equal **Reen Corbett's** record of five open board titles.

"I have had some setbacks and spent four weeks out with torn rib cartilages after being hit by a ski which ruled me out of the Ironwoman but things are going well now and I will definitely be on the starting line in the board race.

"The board has always been close to my heart and it is something that I really enjoy. After being out for so long, it is great to be back in the water

doing what I love."

Over the last decade, Bateup has chalked up an amazing record of qualifying for every open board race final, winning four gold and two silver medals.

Bateup, who won the title at Scarborough in 2009 and before that in 2001, 2003 and 2005 at Kurrawa, is regarded as one of Australia's finest female board paddlers and she is never too far away from the lead pack.

Pluimers, the 2008 National champion, who was third to Bateup in 2009 and to Allira Richardson in 2007, has also appeared in every final since 2004.

She greeted the judge in 2008 in Scarborough when she won the race to the line ahead of Terri Sullivan, Alicia Marriott and Bateup.

Kristyl Smith from Northcliffe, who won the title in 2006, will also be in the firing line with Terrigal's Amy Nurthen, one of the rising stars of the Ironwoman Series, who graduated through the ranks as an outstanding board paddler.

The girls will also be looking to the board relay which has seen three different winners in the last three Aussies.

Northcliffe, with Bateup, Pluimers and Kristy Harris took the title in 2006 and 2007 before Bateup linked with Kurrawa and with Sullivan and Bianca Hewson won the club's first National board relay title.

City of Perth, with Candice Falzon, Jade Whitehead and L Taylor took gold in 2009 before the Hancock sisters, Courtney and Bonnie combined with Katie Graham to cause an upset in 2009.

Falzon has since moved back to Sydney and will this season bolster the Manly ranks which will include Flo Epper and Naomi Flood.

Terrigal with Joanne Baxter, Amy Nurthen and Lauren Hall won last year's under 19 Australian board relay gold and the club will once again be amongst the leading teams in both the under 19 and open board relays with the likes of Lauren Stone and Alicia Bain who along with Nurthen dominated the Central Coast championships, sharing the spoils in the under 19 and open board events.

ECKSTEIN AND SHADE REKINDLE MALIBU DUEL

Shannon Eckstein and Daniel Shade will continue their board paddling duels when they face off in the malibu board at this year's DHL Australian Surf Life Saving Championships at Kurrawa.

Eckstein won his first National malibu board paddling title at Scarborough in 2009 when he edged out Shade and Currumbin's **Michael Saal**.

The year before at Scarborough it was Shade who got the better of Eckstein and fellow Northcliffe star, two-time National Ironman winner Pierce Leonard.

Shade, who has returned to Avoca on the NSW Central Coast after a stint with Kurrawa and a season off, had emerged as one of Australia's hottest young board paddlers, when he won the under 18 National title in 2000.

The following year when it became under 19s it was Eckstein's turn to greet the judge with his board paddling talents.

There has been different winners every year since 1991 with the likes of Bruce Taylor (North Burleigh), Simon Musgrove (Northcliffe), Nathan Smith (Cronulla), Zane Holmes (Kawana), Clint Robinson (Maroochydore), David Foyster (Tugun) and Drew Blatchford (The Lakes) joining the likes of Mick Porra (Coogee, Manly, Surfers Paradise), Steve Warren (North Cronulla), Dwayne Thuys (Seacliff) and Bruce Kolkka (Northcliffe) on the malibu roll of honour.

Winning back-to-back board races at "The Aussies" is rare and in fact the last competitor to achieve successive victories was five-time winner **Trevor Hendy** from Surfers Paradise in 1990 and 1991.

Four other under 19 National champions, **Hugh Dougherty** and **Sam Hamilton** (Tugun), **Mark Bint** (Northcliffe) and **Brendan Schofield** (Terrigal) will all be contenders in 2011 along with Queenscliff's powerhouse **Tom Atkinson**, **Wes Berg** (North Burleigh), **Andrew Mosel** (City of Perth) and **Dean Simpson** (Cronulla).

But because of the nature of the beast, if you 're in the right place at the right time, chasing the right runners then you will be in with a chance of snaring the gold medal.

BINT SET TO TAKE OVER FROM HOLMES IN BATTLE OF THE BOARD RELAY

The question must be asked? Can Northcliffe continue their Australian board relay reign without the one constant in four of the last five open board relay wins – Zane Holmes.

Holmes has been a member of the Kawana Waters and Northcliffe teams that have dominated the prestigious event since 2005 with only the depth of North Burleigh interrupting their reign in 2006.


In 2005, Holmes combined with Hayden Smith and Matthew Sutton to give Kawana its first win in the event but since 2007, the combination of Holmes and fellow Australian Ironman champion Shannon Eckstein and Pierce Leonard have won the gold three years running for Northcliffe.

Northcliffe coach Barry Newman has a host of outstanding paddlers to choose from but it is more than likely former Swansea Belmont under 19 Australian champion Mark Bint will slot into the team as they strive to maintain their dominance.

"Zane is a great man to have in any team but we are lucky to have paddlers like Mark (Bint) who I am sure will step. He's a big tall lad, a great board paddler, who will make the most of any opportunity he is given," said Newman.

Mooloolaba with Matt Poole at the helm; Tugun, with Hugh Dougherty and Sam Hamilton in the engine room; Kurrawa, North Burleigh, Manly, Queenscliff, Avoca, Redhead and Currumbin are sure to be among the challengers in what will be another helter skelter affair in the race for gold.

DID YOU KNOW? Northcliffe won its first ever Open Board Relay Championship with Dick Cahill, his brother Mick and Norm Lewis in 1970 and again in 1972 before John Holmes (Zane's father) joined Dick and Norm to take the title again in 1973.

"AUSSIES" FLASH BACK TWENTY YEARS AGO

Wanda, 1981

AUSSIES SURF TEAMS WIN WORTH ITS WAIT IN GOLD

Freshwater swimmers **Darren Bogg** and **Jon Harker** both knew that they had a great chance of winning the Australian Open Surf Teams title at Wanda in 1981 if only their two other team mates turned up.

It was Friday morning and the heats of the Open Surf Teams were scheduled for that afternoon...but their other two team members, Australia's emerging 1500m swimmer **Tim Ford** and his fellow AIS Swim Team scholarship holder **Graeme "Grub" Carroll** were holed up in Canberra.

The pair were scheduled to train on Saturday morning and AIS Director **Don Talbot** had barred the pair from swimming in the surf, something the tough-as-teak Swim Coach had always frowned upon.

But 48 hours of talks between the Freshwater management, Federal MP for Warringah **Michael McKellar** and Talbot resolved the matter, after it had been raised in Parliament.

Once resolved, It meant a frantic 11th hour trip from the Northern Beaches to the Nation's capital for club captain **David Donnelly** and Freshwater's number one supporter and champion boat sweep-cum-March Past champion **Tom Whelan** in the early hours of the morning.

Harker, one of several stillwater swimmers recruited into the club in the late 70s from the Auburn and Carlile Swimming Clubs, admitted to Bogg – who would become one of the club's all-time greats, it could go one of two ways.

"Either Boggy and I would sit and watch the race on the beach or we'd be running up alongside Tim and 'Grub' on our way towards gold medals," recalled Harker, now a successful media and marketing executive with his own company, Hark Attack, after a successful career in radio and television.

"Don let the boys off training and as they say in the classics the rest is history – it was a fairytale ending, we won the gold medal and while Darren and I ended up celebrating and Darren was named in the Australian team, Tim and 'Grub' went back to Canberra.

"I think Don made them train on Sunday afternoon to make up for the session they missed."

Ford would go on to win silver in the 1500m at the 1982 Commonwealth Games and become a successful marketing executive

ALLUM'S IRONMAN EFFORT FAR FROM HALF-HEARTED

Home town hero Greg Allum had to paddle 400 metres around the final leg of his Ironman semi-final on half-a-board after smashing it in half on a two-metre wave at the 1981 Australian Championships at Wanda Beach.

Allum, the 1979 Australian champion, was desperate to qualify for the final on his home beach and had to pull out all stops to qualify.

Much to the delight of the local crowd Allum actually caught a wave to the beach on his "shortened board" to finish fifth and make the cut off for Sunday's final, won by defending champion Grant Kenny with 1972 Olympian, the late Robbie Nay (Northcliffe) third.

Kenny had created history the year before when he won the junior-open Ironman double at Maroochydore and was backing up to attempt the feat again, only to be denied by Cronulla's Russell Cooper in the under 18 event..

It was the next chapter in what would be one of the great surf lifesaving careers for Kenny, who won the junior single ski title and also finished third in the junior board to long-time rival and future Australian Ironman champion Dwayne Thuys (Seacliff, SA) and Cronulla's Mal Butterfield.

Nay was also a member of the victorious Northcliffe crew that won the Taplin Relay with the board paddling Kolkka brothers Bruce and Noel, veteran ski men Len Woods and Peter McGrath and swimmer David Hoskins, defeating Wanda and Coogee.

The Kolkka boys then combined with local lifeguard Billy Eckstein (Shannon and Caine's father) to defend the malibu board relay title they'd won in Maroochydore, beating Cronulla and North Cronulla. Eckstein had also been in the Currumbin Beach Vikings team with Dick Cahill and Peter Lacey that won the title in 1977.

The open board title in 1981 saw Coogee's pocket-rocket Mick Porra defend his crown, defeating three-time champion and arch-rival Steve Warren (North Cronulla) with Eckstein third.

It was the start of a brilliant career for Porra who would go on to win a total of 14 gold medals with Coogee, Manly and Surfers Paradise.

Warren had won three Australian board titles in 1975, 1976 and 1979 amongst his total of 16 and in 1982 he, Olympian Ken Vidler (Scarboro) with 20 gold medals and the great, late Peter Lacey (Lorne, Currumbin and Surfers Paradise) with 14 gold, were named the three greatest Australian surf sports competitors at the SLSA's 75th Anniversary Dinner.

A fitting tribute to three of the all-time greats of the surf.
