STUART SNELL GUNNING FOR THIRD **CHAMPION LIFESAVER GOLD**

A nagging bursa in his shoulder won't stop Northcliffe's **Stuart Snell** from striving for his own personal slice of Australian Surf Life Saving history at this year's DHL 2011 Aussies at Kurrawa from April 2-9.

Snell, 31, is the two-time and defending Champion Lifesaver in 2009 and 2010

and gold in 2011 will make him only the second competitor to win three in a row.

The original Champion Lifesaver Trent Balym from Currumbin actually won five titles between 1998 and 2002.

"I've been out of the water for a couple of weeks and have had cortisone injections but the thought of winning three in a row has kept me going," says Snell, who came to Australia from Welsh club Southerdowns eight seasons ago.

"To win a third Australian Championship would be amazing but it's not going to be easy, the competition is always tough and this year will be no different."

Snell is among surf lifesaving's unsung heroes – an Ironman in his own right who CHAMPION LIFESAVER: Stuart Snell.

Snell, a schoolteacher at Surfers Paradise State School, combines his Ironman training with his theory and practical training every week.

"I swim four to five swim sessions up to six kilometres a session; two to three board sessions, plus running and ski training and we get together every week for the practical sessions and I try and read up on my theory a couple of nights a week as well," said Snell.

"It is challenging but very rewarding and actually quite nerve-wracking on competition day, not knowing how you have gone until the very end when they start reading out the results from sixth to first."

Snell is also a member of the champion Northcliffe Patrol Team, who are trying to stretch their winning streak to ten as they attempt to equal the legendary Currumbin Vikings team that won ten straight between 1992 and 2001.

(The Vikings won 14 Championships between 1987 and 2001, when Northcliffe started their run of nine victories).

Victory will also be sweet for Damien Moffrey and Trent Rowe who will set what will be an extraordinary record of ten straight gold medals as members of the victorious Northcliffe team.

No Australian lifesaver has ever won eight straight, let alone nine or ten and

write their names into the annals of Surf Life Saving history if they can pull off this extraordinary feat.

It will also be a special time for former South Australian youngster Jake Nicholson, recruited into the team for Emma McKenzie and who joins Snell, Moffrey, Rowe, Kathryn McKenzie and Nic Pluimers in the all-conquering squad.

Nicholson continues the Grange connection in the Northcliffe team, which saw Adam Jones (a member of the Grange six that won silver to Currumbin in 2000) transfer to Northcliffe in 2004 for the first of his seven gold medals.

NORTHCLIFFE DOMINATE QLD CHAMPS

Northcliffe signalled their attentions for this year's Aussies when they took out the honours at the 2011 Laerdal Queensland Surf Rescue Championships ahead of defending champion Dicky Beach and Alexandra Headland.

The annual championships saw more than 100 of the Sate's top surf lifesavers from as far and wide as Forrest Beach right through to Tweed Heads converge on Broadbeach to put their surf rescue skills to the ultimate test in their bid to be crowned Queensland's Champion Lifesaver.

Snell and fellow Champion Patrol Team member **Kathryn McKenzie** won the coveted Open Male and Female Champion Lifesaver events, while Northcliffe extended its unbeaten run in the prestigious Open Patrol Competition to a record **11** years.

Maroochydore's team of Fiona Meridith and Patrick Lafferty took the honours in the Open First Aid competition, and Alexandra Headlands featured prominently in the Under-17 and Under-19 age divisions. SURF LIFESAVING QLD RESULTS

In NSW, Cronulla's **Ben Orford**, third to Snell and **Michael White** (Alexandra Headlands) in last year's Aussies, won the Champion Lifesaver event at the All Phones NSW Championships at Kingscliff from North Steyne's **Shannon Job** and Cronulla's **Daryn Metti**.

In the women's Champion Lifesaver, Manly's three-time Australian champion **Mel Pelly** added another NSW crown to her impressive tally in a sky blue quinella, with team mate **Emma Jolly** second and **Tara Johnston** (Helensburg Stanwell Park) third.

Coogee won the Open Patrol Competition from Ocean Beach Blue. At the WA State Championships at Scarborough, City of Perth's **Josh Walker** won gold in the Champion Lifesaver from teammate **Eoghan McKenna** with **Blair Redfern** (Scarboro) third with Mullaloo taking the Patrol Competition from Fremantle and Scarboro.

At Lakes Entrance for the Victorian State Championships, it was a Jan Juc sweep with **David Ulbrick, Stephen lannazzo** and **Leigh Ryan** completing a spectacular trifecta before leading Jan Juc to victory in the Champion Patrol Team from Apollo Bay.

At the SA State at Christies Beach, **Jason Matte** (Grange) won the Champion Lifesaver while **Alexandra Cobia** (Brighton) won gold in the Women's event . <u>SURF LIFESAVING SA RESULTS</u>

FRESHIE'S PROUD R&R HISTORY

The Freshwater club on Sydney's Northern Beaches has a long and proud history when it comes to one of the original events on the SLSA program, the Rescue and Resuscitation or R and R.

The club has won eight National R and R titles – including the coveted Six Person R and R, named in honour of one of the movement's most celebrated president's, the judge Sir Adrian Curlewis, on five occasions.

Freshwater will arrive at Kurrawa this year determined to add another gold medal to their impressive tally and defend the title they won in 2009 and write some more history.

The team of Alan Burns, Ian Donald, Wayne Freakley, Peter Obern, Chris Tyrell and Jo Kirkby, coached by Ken Priest, turned the clock back almost 50 years when they won the flag two years ago and have made just one change to that team for 2011 with Donna Kelleher coming in for Kirkby.

It will be a major step back in time for Freakley, a member of the club's 1978 NSW State Championship winning team that ran third to North Cronulla at the Aussies at Kingscliff – over 30 years ago. Burns (pictured below left) will also chalk up a remarkable milestone, pulling the belt for the club and celebrating his 60^{th} birthday – 43 years after winning silver for Clovelly in the under 18 surf teams in 1968.

Freakley praised Burns and admitted he has an unwritten contract that once he is slower than 30 seconds behind in the swim then it's time to retire.

"He's a remarkable beltman, still going strong after all these years and doesn't look like slowing down; he's certainly an inspiration," said Freakley, who was also equally in awe of Obern, himself a former Australian under 16 and 18 surf teams winner, who swims the belt in the 5-man team.

Freshie were crowned National champions four times between 1953 and 1960, producing an impeccable record that saw them unbeaten in 15 starts in 1958-59.

Their success came under the instruction of one of lifesaving's toughest task masters in Lionel McDonald and included Australian representatives Ray "Soccer" Matheson, John Mills, Barry Lumsdaine, Jock McPhee and Don 'Ducker" Williams, who were joined by the likes of ABC TV commentator Norman "Nuggett" May, 1948 Olympic swimmer Bruce Bourke, Clarrie Williams, Dick Evans, George Mullins and John Forbes.

NSW STATE AGE, Kingscliff - MANLY MAINTAIN AGE RAGE

Manly has defended its crown at the **2011 Allphones NSW Age Surf Life Saving Championships.**

Manly (230 points) emerged victorious against arch rivals North Cronulla (205.5) and Cronulla (178).

Among Manly's winners were **Cooper Krenkels** in the U14 years surf race; the All Age Board Relay; the U13 Cameron and Beach Relays; **Andrew Newling** in the U11 years board; **Angus McBean** in the U9 beach sprint and **Eliza Curll** in the U 9 surf race.

Brothers **Matt** and **Joel Bevilacqua** were outstanding for host club Clifton Beach at the Tasmanian State Championships.

Matt won the under 19 and Open Ironman and board race doubles as well as the open surf and U19 single ski, while little brother Joel won the U17 Ironman and was second in the U17 surf race and third in the open board, U17 ski and open surf race

The boys were also prominent in the Open Surf Teams and Joel in the under 17 Taplin wins while there was no stopping the brothers in the open board rescue.

Anglesea, the 2010 DHL National Club of the Year, stole the show at the 2011 Victorian State Championships.

With the ski paddling **Penny** brothers **Will** and **Tom**, joined by veteran Shane Edmonds and brilliant youngsters **Joel Simondson**, **James Porter** and **Campbell McDonald** the club won the prestigious Taplin Relay.

Simondson, who won the U17 surf and Ironman and was second to Scott Prosser (Jan Juc) in the open surf race, produced the swim of his life in Taplin.

On the beach **Hayley Atkins** led an Anglesea trifecta from sisters **Claire** and **Abbey Lewtas.**

WA STATE, Scarborough - TRIGG ON TOP AS HUITENGA STARS

Trigg Island won the Overall Pointscore but it was City of Perth's **Simon Huitenga** who was named the 2011 Bernie Kelly medal winner, for the most outstanding performance by an individual competitor.

Trigg led the overall point score all weekend and finished on 848 points, ahead of City of Perth (683) and Mullaloo (656).

Huitenga chalked up wins in the Open Ironman and surf race, was a member of the winning Rescue Tube team and also picked up a bronze in the Taplin Relay.

City's **Jade Whitehead** was another athlete to have a successful weekend of racing, finishing with seven gold medals, one silver and two bronze and whilst she claimed the U19 Ironwoman, Whitehead couldn't hang on in the open Ironwoman and finished with bronze in a City trifecta, with 16-year-old **Natasha Browne** winning the gold and club-mate **Kirsty Hardstaff** the silver. **SURF LIFESAVING WA RESULTS**

NOW THE MAROOCHYDORE R & R BOYS ARE ON THE COMEBACK TRAIL

It seems it's the season for aquatic comebacks with **Libby Trickett, Michael Klim** and **Ian Thorpe** back in the water and now former Australian R and R champions Maroochydore are getting in on the act. The 2011 Aussies will see the return to competition of the 2004 National Champions in both the Open 5 Man and the Senior 6 Person events after the team retired in 2006.

The team of **David McBurnie**, **John Sayers**, **Dr. Andrew Staib**, **Danny Short**, **John Baxter** and **Jae Marr** will once again be coached by R and R legend, **Len Harris**, a former Australian champion and Australian champion coach with Bondi, Coogee and Maroochydore.

Short and Baxter, have been outstanding surf swimmers, sharing in Maroochydore's 1993 Taplin Relay win with one of the great line ups which included Olympian Clint Robinson, Kirk Jarrott, Ashley Massie and Heath Collie and taking silver with Maroochydore in the open surf teams in 1996, while Short also tasted gold in the victorious Taplin teams of 1994 and 1997.

In the first couple of sessions there was stiffness of the joints, but their overall drill showed they still had it, although sometimes when they arrived for training it was like a mobile crèche turning up at the beach.

Win lose or draw, there will be a big support crew for Maroochydore's "Dad's Army" when they turn back the clock, beginning at next week's **Crazy Johns Queensland State Championships at Kurrawa** – a warm up for The Aussies, with the R and R scheduled for Broadbeach between April 7 and 10.

"AUSSIES" FLASH BACK FORTY YEARS AGO

City of Perth, 1971

KIRRA THE TOAST OF THE COAST WITH BACK-TO-BACK R & R WINS

Back in 1971 the Senior R and R championship of Australia was recognised as the Blue Ribband event on the Surf Life Saving calendar and 40 years on Kirra's stalwart **Bob Littler** recalls it was "the one everyone wanted to win."

"It was the major event on the program, with enormous prestige attached to winning the Senior R and R and we went into City of Perth as the defending champions," said Littler, now a semi-retired cattle farmer on the NSW Far North Coast.

"We had won the title in 1968 and 1970 and it was a very competitive field with clubs from every State vying for the title and the SLSA dangled the carrot of Australian team selection and a trip to Taiwan to the winning team.

"I remember **Cam Leigh-Murray** drew the belt swim and **Vic Arnall** (my cousin) the patient swim and we actually defeated North Cronulla (who had won the title in 1969) and Bondi (who would win in 1972)."

Littler also revealed that because the squad of **Leigh-Murray**, Arnall, **Col Wright**, **Peter Kelly**, **Peter Whippell** and himself, under the direction of master coach **Arch Nicholson** all lived in Brisbane, the majority of their training was done on grass.

"We would do all our swimming training then two evenings a week we would do our drill work on the lawn at Langlands Park Pool – it was ideal for our timing and may well have been the secret to our success.

"Our beach work would be done on weekends at Kirra and also at Southport in the lead up to the major championships."

It was a season to remember for Littler, who was also a member of the Australian team for a three-Test Series against South Africa at Lorne, Burleigh Heads and Coogee and captain of the Queensland State Surf Team in WA.

"Personally it was probably the highlight of my career and to top it off with a win in the R and R and to tour Taiwan was great," said Littler.

Littler and several members of the team including Leigh-Murray, Arnall, Wright, Whippell and himself attended a 40 year reunion late last year to celebrate the formation of Life Saving in the Chinese state.

"It was a great experience to go back there and see how far it has come in 40 years and to think that we played a part in setting it up was very special," said Littler.

Kirra won again in 1977 (with Littler and Kelly still in the team) and in 1979 with a new look team, which included Olympian Graham White, when they also won the Australian junior R and R title..

Littler then went on to coach the Kirra juniors to victory in 1982 and 1983 with son Scott lining up in the team.

NORM RABJOHNS FIVE YEAR WAIT FOR GOLD

Currumbin's **Norm Rabjohns** remains as laid back today as he was when he was crowned Australian ironman champion back in 1971 at City of Perth.

His five-year wait for Ironman gold was certainly worth it.

Rabjohns and **Len Wood** from Pacific had been the men synonymous with surf lifesaving and early Ironman racing on the Gold Coast in the mid 60s, Wood finishing third to **Hayden Kenny** and **Barry Rodgers** respectively in 1966 and 1967 while Rabjohns was third to Rodgers in 1968 and 1969.

The following year in Victoria, with water events transferred from Ocean Grove to Fisherman's Beach at Torquay, Rabjohns was 200m in front going into the final leg and it was "put down your glasses" until the surf Gods turned on him and the field came from behind.

Trigg Island's **Fred Annesley** eventually won the title, leaving Rabjohns off the podium in fourth.

But the following year in Perth saw Rabjohns grab a deserved National title, something he describes as one of the toughest events of his career.

"I didn't think it was a big deal back then but I do remember it was a tough race," recalled Rabjohns, who is now based out of Manly, 20km north of Brisbane and runs a charter boat out of Gladstone in the winter months.

"It was flat out from the outset and I remember crossing the line and just wanted to collapse back in the water but all the boys came up and kept patting me on the back — it felt like electrodes going through my body.


"Ironman racing is tough but you also need a little bit of luck along the way and that doesn't always happen."

Rabjohns would line up again for a comfortable victory at Blacksmith's Beach, Swansea Belmont the following year, defeating **Geoff Dews** (Wanda) and Maroubra's three time champion, Rodgers and he also added the single ski title for good measure.


He would also finish third on another two occasions – to Cottesloe's **Simon Martin** at Glenelg in 1974 and Olympian **Ken Vidler** at Dee Why in 1975.

Rabjohns would also play a key role in the victorious Currumbin Taplin Relay teams of 1977, 1978 and 1979 with the Vikings winning the National Club Pointscore in 1977 at Bancoora, capping off a distinguished career.

In other events in 1977; WA's favourite son surfing Ken Vidler started his amazing career with victory in only the second U18 Ironman championship from Guy Oakley (Maroubra) and Peter Milburn (Torquay); Sydney police inspector Warren Molloy swept Queenscliff to victory in the open boat; Collaroy with Olympian Mark Anderson, Commonwealth Games swimmer Buddy Portier and noted surf swimmers Inky Montgomery and Mike Bradford won the open surf teams; Leigh Emery from Bondi the open belt although South African Chris Milford touched the buoy first; while Rick Wilkinson (North Cronulla) won the open surf.
