BLAZING PADDLES FOR FIGHTER PILOTS OF THE SURF

Four-time Olympian **Danny Collins** knows just how competitive it is when the gun goes in an Australian open single ski race final.

Like so many elite ski paddlers, the Olympic silver and bronze medallist has mixed and matched it with the best in the world on flat-water and in the surf.

"I grew up in Blacktown in the western suburbs of Sydney and we used to go to Avoca on the Central Coast on weekends and that's where I was introduced to surf clubs and paddling," said Collins.

"Champions like **Greg Jarmaine** and **Murray Braund** taught me how to paddle and I owe them a lot for getting me started, especially Jarmaine, who always had time for youngsters."

Collins went on to represent Australia at the 1992, 1996, 2000 and 2004 Olympic Games, winning K2 500 bronze and silver with partner **Andrew Trim in** Atlanta and Sydney respectively.

And like so many of his paddling peers Collins continued to pick up his surf ski paddle when the surf carnival season came around.

The closest he ever got to individual Aussies gold came in 1995 when he deadheated for silver with North Burleigh team mate **David Reeves**, behind 13-time winner and Olympic gold medallist **Clint Robinson** in a hotly contested single ski final at Kurrawa.

He then won double ski gold with **Heath Brown** from North Burleigh in the same year before taking the doubles title again, this time with Ironman **Trevor Hendy** for Surfers Paradise in 1998.

"The single has always been one of the most competitive events on the Aussies program and I would like to have won just one title so that's why you have to dip your hat to Clint for winning 13...amazing stuff," Collins said."

"To win two double ski golds was pretty special and I'm thankful for them. "Competition will be no different this year, as soon as the gun goes it will be like a group of fighter pilots flying through the surf.

"The break will make a huge difference and sorts out the field that's for sure so much will depend on the conditions.

"But there is no doubt the single ski be one of the 'must watch' events on the Aussies program."

WALLACE HEADS AN ALL-STAR OLYMPIC FIELD

Of the Olympians who are vying for top ski honours, there is none bigger than Tugun's Beijing golden boy **Ken Wallace** and his 2008 team mates **Tate Smith** (Northcliffe), **Jacob Clear** (Burleigh Heads-Mowbray Park) and **David Smith** (Warilla Barrack Point) who all head an impressive list.

It's a list that will also include London hopeful, 2009 and defending champion Murray Stewart (Manly); two-time Olympian, 2007 champion and reigning NSW Champion Peter Scott; renown kayaker and World Cup medallist Luke Morrison (Moana, SA), emerging kayaker Joel Simpson and New Zealand champion Kevin Morrison (Northcliffe) and Brendan Sarson (Trigg Island).

Wallace has won 13 Aussies gold medals, including five open Taplin titles and the under 18 and under 19 single ski but he has never won an Australian open single ski championship – something that he would dearly love in his trophy cabinet.

"With so much emphasis on my kayaking career I hardly get the chance to jump on the ski these days but I always look forward to the Aussies," said Wallace.

"All of us would dearly love to win the open single title and it is so competitive and in the surf anything can happen.

"But I certainly enjoy the team events and will line up in the Taplin Relay again as well as the ski relay and the mixed double ski with my sister Bernadette."

Redhead's **Peter Scott**, at 37 is still mixing it with the younger brigade and showed his paddling power, his prowess and his surf knowhow to add another NSW State singles crown to his medal tally, as well as the double ski and ski relay.

"There is nothing like winning the Aussies," said Scott, who finally broke through for his Australian single ski gold, beating Robinson and Maroochydore's **Ben Allen** in 2007.


"To paddle across that line knowing you are the Australian champion is something all of us paddlers aspire to."

Scott had finished third to Robinson in 2001 and again in 2008 and will line up in a field of almost 500 in 2011.

It will be a case of gloves off boys as the fighter pilots start their engines.

FLOOD'S OVERFLOW IN AUSSIES ASSAULT

Naomi Flood doesn't believe it doing things by halves and when she lines up for this year's Aussies she may well be missing from the Ironwoman field but she will certainly be going all out to make her presence felt

Flood retired from professional Ironwoman racing last year to concentrate on having a crack at the 2012 London Olympic kayak team.

And so far, so good for Flood, who will undergo a final World Championship trial in Sydney next Monday and Tuesday.

She was one of the real stars of the Australian Canoe Kayak Sprint Nationals in Adelaide and sits in the box seat for a major selection step towards London.

Flood, now based at the AIS on the Gold Coast, under head women's coach and Olympian **Katrin Borchert**, is a professional athlete again "without making the money."

"I feel like I have made the right move at the right time to join the AIS group," said Flood.

"I am feeling good and happy within myself. I am living at Miami and ride my bike two kilometres to the AIS training base twice a day and I do feel like I'm getting there.

"And I get invited to the Olympic processing next Wednesday so that's exciting."

Then it's back in the surf for Flood, who will be re-united with her Manly club mates for an all-out assault on the Aussies.

She will contest six events; including the single ski, as she chases her second National title, as well as the double ski, mixed double, ski relay, Taplin Relay and also the women's belt which she won last year.

"I am really looking forward to the Aussies and getting to sit under the Manly tent again – it is so much fun," said Flood.

"We have a great group of girls and to have **Candice Falzon** with us this year is very exciting, she's so dedicated."

IRONMAN SHANNON WANTS A PIECE OF THE SKI RELAY ACTION

Ironman Shannon Eckstein is itching to get the chance to spread his wings into Northcliffe's champion ski relay team following the withdrawal from the Aussies of fellow Ironman Zane Holmes.

Holmes has been part of the last two Northcliffe teams to have won the Aussies, with Nick Crilly and Olympian **Tate Smith**.

And with Crilly now part of the coaching staff at North Burleigh, it leaves two spots open in the defending champion's team.

Kayak paddler **Joel Simpson**, New Zealand's **Kevin Morrison** and emerging paddler **Michael Booth** are three paddlers the Northcliffe selectors can also choose from in a team that will once again be tough to beat.

Manly, with 2009 Australian single ski champion **Murray Stewart**, fellow kayaker **Nick Dawe** and the ever-present **Blake Ballard** are sure to be among the major contenders.

Stewart has been one of the form paddlers in the kayak season and is on track towards London for next year's Olympics.

The sky blues won silver to Northcliffe in 2009 with Kurrawa, boosted by **Caine Eckstein**'s arrive this year, taking bronze.

Others to watch out for include, Redhead, Trigg Island, Cronulla, Tugun, Mooloolaba and Warilla Barrack Point, led by promising youngster **Hayden White**.

STATE ROUND-UP

QLD STATE AGE, Coolangatta: MAROOCHYDORE NIP NORTHCLIFFE ON THE LINE

Maroochydore took out Surf Life Saving Queensland's Junior State Championships in dramatic circumstances, edging out Gold Coast club Northcliffe by just four points at Coolangatta last weekend.

After three days of competition, the Championships ended in nail-biting circumstances with both teams forced to wait until the final race on Sunday to confirm the result.

Northcliffe entered the third and final day of competition just four points adrift of their Sunshine Coast rival and were given a sniff of a victory when Mitchell Coombes snared gold in the Under-11 Ironman and Elly Wikaire took out the Under-12 Ironwoman.

But a raft of consistent performances from the Maroochydore youngsters was enough to hold off their fast-finishing rival and secure a famous victory.

There was some consolation for Northcliffe with the club taking out the Handicap Point Score ahead of Maroochydore and Noosa Heads. **SURF LIFESAVING QLD JNR RESULTS**

NSW STATE, Kingscliff: KENDRICK CALLS ON MATES TO CLAIM FIRST NSW OPEN CROWN

Collaroy's Kendrick Louis will again carry the spirit and memories of two of his great mates when he heads to Kurrawa next month, determined to tackle the enemy in their own backyard.

Louis, who has won the under 15, under 17 and under 19 Australian Championship, showed why he will be a major contender for Aussies gold with an eye-catching win in driving rain at the All-Phones NSW Champion ship at Kingscliff.

"The past couple of years, I have lost two great mates in the ocean, Jacob Lollback and Saxon Bird," he said.

"Jacob used to stay at my house and when he passed away (after drowning on a fishing trip in 2009) it was very emotional. I know if Saxon was here he would have been right on my hammer (in the ironman).

"My first individual gold in the (NSW) opens is something I have wanted for a while."

Louis tells of the spirit he has gained from his two special mates and his drive to take on the Queenslanders at the Australian Championships when he spoke to Aussies TV.

There was also plenty of joy for Cronulla and Many as the sky blue caps, without Olympic kayak hopeful Naomi Flood, again took the pointscore.

Manly were led by Devon Halligan who won the under 19 Ironwoman and Surf race and played a key role in the swim leg of the winning Taplin Relay Team with ski paddler Sarah Knapman and new recruit, board paddler Candace Falzon who also feature on Aussies TV.

Cronulla were best served by their open men, led by surf and belt race champion Chris Allum, the evergreen Nathan Smith and the winner of the Under 19 Saxon Bird Memorial Surf Race, Kyle O'Brien. See them on Aussies TV.

"AUSSIES" FLASH BACK 50 YEARS AGO

Moana, 1961

80,000 FLOCK TO MOANA TO SEE MANLY WIN R AND R

Fifty years ago and it was still six years before the birth of the Ironman. A time when the R and R, the open surf, the open belt and the open boat were considered the major events on the surf life saving program.

At the Australian Championships of 1961, it is estimated that "80,000 people were attracted to the carnival along one-and-half miles of beach and the 56 hectare paddock had 30,000 cars park in it, with 14 policemen controlling the crowd."

Three clubs, Moana, Henley and Christies formed the organising committee and according to Barry Galton's "Gladiators of the Surf" "the championships were conducted in one of the flattest surfs ever seen at a Championships helping the swimmers."

The premiership R and R saw a change in the guard with the retirement of the majority of the reigning champion Freshwater team, leaving the way for arch enemy Manly to add their eighth championship under the instruction of **Alan "The Whip" May**.

The team of Barry Taylor, Roger Griffiths, Bob Padman, John Kissane, Malcolm Bell and Frank Ellis defeated Kirra and Cottesloe.

It also saw victory to Swansea Caves (NSW) in the coveted open boat race final, with surf boat rowing's "Mr Nice Guy" **Ken Murray** sweeping his famed crew, which included the long-serving **Ellercamp** brothers, **Paul** and **Don**, who proved too strong for Sydney Branch rivals Cronulla and Wanda.

With Murray at the helm, Caves crews were never far off the pace over the next two decades and he was still going strong in 1980 when selected in the NSW team to tour Europe, showing the Brits how to negotiate big waves in the pounding seas at Bude.

Moana saw the emergence of some of the legends of the surf, including one of SLSA's all-time greats in Southport's favourite son **John Ogilvie**, who captained Queensland to their first ever victory over arch rivals NSW in the annual Inter-State Championships, held before the Inter-Club titles.

Ogilvie would beat reigning Australian champion **Neville Cox** (Wanda) in the Inter-State belt race before swimming down the field in the R and R belt swim. **Photographs:**

ANOTHER NOTCH FOR "HUTCHO"

Bondi's all-time great **Brian Hutchings**, a three-time Australian open surf race winner, won his first open belt title from **Hayden Kenny**, who was also a member of the Queensland State Team and who would go on to win the first Australian Ironman title in 1966.

"Hutcho" had already racked up three open surf race titles in 1954, 1956 and 1959 and he would win his second belt title at Warnambool in 1963.

Olympian **Jon Donohoe**, arguably one of Australia's best surf swimmers of his era, won the open surf from Maroubra's **Barry Rodgers** and Maroochydore's 1960 Rome Olympian **John Rigby**.

It was his third title after beating Hutchings and Tweed Heads Coolangatta's **John Gibson** in 1960 and Maroubra's **John Rodgers** and Hutchings in 1958.

According to *Barry Galton*, Donohoe and Rigby swam stroke for stroke in the calm seas, with Donohoe gradually edging ahead. He was first to the sandbank where he was able to stand and wade home to victory.

Donohoe was renowned for the way he planned his races.

He studied the surf very closely, prowling up and down the area, studying the waves, currents and sandbanks.

The North Bondi boy would go on to become one of Australia's leading retail and sports marketing executives and would join **Norman May** as a regular voice of ABC-TVs Aussies coverage.

His good friend, Olympic kayaker **Phil Coles** (North Bondi) would win his third single ski title and future Olympian and respected Australian team coach and manager the late **Terry Buck** would win the Junior surf race for his beloved Clovelly.

The open surf teams would go to Newcastle who had started to build up quite an impressive group of powerful swimmers, led by **Warren Chipchase**.
